Company Overview

Struck by the number of children, 1 in 4, in North Florida who live daily with hunger, Sherri Porter founded Hunger Fight in 2012. Headquartered in Jacksonville, FL, the IRS designated 501c3 nonprofit organization's programming focuses on two of the biggest issues that impacts a child's success in life; food insecurity and lack of reading skills. Hunger Fight is addressing these issues with its two-pronged programmatic approach for children living in poverty.

How Hunger Impacts Children

Health

- Children who struggle with hunger are sick more often, recover more slowly, and are more likely to be hospitalized.
- They are more likely to experience headaches, stomachaches, colds, ear infections and fatigue.
- Children who face hunger are more susceptible to obesity and its harmful health consequences as children and as adults.

Cognition and Academics

- · Undernourished children cannot learn as much, as fast or as well
- Lack of enough nutritious food impairs a child's ability to concentrate and perform well in school.

Emotional and Social Well-Being

 Children who regularly do not get enough nutritious food to eat have significantly higher levels of behavioral, emotional and academic problems and may be more aggressive and anxious. Youth who regularly do not get enough to eat are more likely to be suspended from school and have difficulty getting along with other kids and may be more aggressive and anxious.





With 46% of 3rd graders not reading at grade level Hunger Fight decided to collaborate with the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, a nationally known literacy program to get books in the hands of children and families.

- Literacy skills begin at birth and build on relationships and experiences that occur during infancy and early childhood.
- 90% of a child's critical brain development occurs by age 5
- Emergent literacy has the biggest impact on the academic success of a child, is the root of reading success and forms the basis for learning in all subjects.
- Children who receive higher quality education by age five are 70% more likely to graduate from high school
- Program serves those most at risk; children ages 0-5
- Books that are age and developmentally appropriate are mailed every month directly to the child at their home
- Books plant the seeds for dreams and opportunities for a lifetime
