

Parity Pickleball Mission

“Parity Pickleball” organized group play is focused on developing a culture of evenly matched, balanced Pickleball games where the primary focus will be on player matchups of reasonable skill level parity. It is believed that games with more balanced skill levels are more enjoyable for all participants. The goal is simply FUN for everyone! Reasonable efforts will be made to obtain the best quality matchups given the players in attendance.

Process in Parity Pickleball

In contrast to other times of organized play, the primary factor of determining the next group of players will be skill level parity (within reason). Time waiting is the next factor however; no one will have to sit out an unreasonable amount of time to join a game.

To help facilitate this, the following court structure will be used as a guideline. This is flexible and depending on the skill mix in attendance can be adjusted. Skill level is a relative term based on who is in attendance. No one should be sitting out multiple games.

Starting nearest the front doors:

Court 1: Lowest Range Skill Level in attendance

Court 2: Mid Range Skill Level in attendance

Court 3: Highest Range Skill Level in attendance

Players can choose which court to play on. They are free to play up and down the courts and gravitate to the desired level. If based on attendance, one court is being overused by particular players, after 2-3 games, they must share the court with others waiting for a different court. If 4 specific players want to be grouped in a game, they must wait one game behind others mixing the matchups.

Common sense, courtesy and reasonableness will govern with the above being a flexible guideline.
